SPACE PLANNING: THE FOUNDATION OF A FUNCTIONAL HOME

Space planning is more than arranging furniture, it's about creating rooms that feel good, function well, and support your lifestyle now and in the future. Whether you're refreshing a living room, renovating, or designing a new build, thoughtful planning sets the tone for a harmonious home.

Assessing Your Space

Start by looking at your space with intention. Ask yourself:

- What do I want this space to do
- What activities will happen here
- Who will be using it
- Do I need storage
- Are there elements I must work around (windows, fireplaces, built-ins, exterior doors)
- Do any areas need to be accessible (no thresholds, wheelchair-friendly, etc.)

Writing down your answers helps, not what someone else's home requires.

Space Planning Standards

Once you know your needs, outline the furniture you have or plan to buy. Even beautiful pieces fall flat if the layout doesn't support movement, conversation, and daily routines.

Universal spacing guidelines:

- 36"–48" of clearance for main traffic paths (the path you'd take the most often to get from point A to point B)
- 24" for secondary paths (the path less frequently used, but still there)
- 16"–18" between a sofa and coffee table
- 40" minimum around a dining table for comfortable seating

These standards create rooms that feel balanced and intuitive. They also reveal when items are too close together, or too far apart.

Common Space Planning Mistakes (and How to Avoid Them)

Living Room

- Choose a rug large enough to anchor the seating area.
- Pair substantial seating with appropriately scaled tables.
- Avoid pushing all furniture against the walls.

Dining Room

- Match the table shape to the room's proportions.
- Hang light fixtures 30"–36" above the table.
- Add a credenza or buffet for storage and visual weight.
- Artwork above a credenza should be about $\frac{3}{4}$ the width of the furniture and hung 8"–12" above it.
- For general artwork, aim for 5'–6" from floor to centre unless furniture placement requires otherwise.

Final Thoughts

Space planning is both practical and personal. It's the foundation of a home that feels intentional, comfortable, and beautifully aligned with your everyday life. When you start with function, work the standards, and pay careful attention to proportion and flow, you create not just a room but a lifestyle that truly supports you.

Choosing the right paint is about more than colour – it’s about performance, durability, and confidence in the product you’re bringing into your home. Selecting a Canadian-manufactured paint designed for our climate helps ensure long-lasting results while also supporting local jobs and communities.

A successful paint project starts with preparation. Before opening a can, move furniture away from the walls and protect your floors with drop sheets. Cleaning the surface is essential; dust, grease, or residue can prevent paint from adhering properly. Take a few minutes to fill small holes or cracks so the finished wall looks smooth and even.

Next comes protection and precision. Applying painter’s tape around trim, ceilings, and windows helps create crisp lines and reduces the need for touch-ups.

If you’re covering new drywall, repaired areas, or making a significant colour change, using a primer will help ensure consistent coverage and improve the durability of the final coat. When painting begins, start by “cutting in” around edges and corners with a brush. This allows the roller to blend seamlessly across the larger wall surfaces. Rolling in a W pattern helps distribute paint evenly and avoid visible lines. High-quality paints with strong hide can often reduce the number of coats required, saving time and effort.

Allow adequate drying time before removing tape and returning furniture to the room. Rushing this step can affect the finish and lead to smudging or peeling.

For the best results, take time to plan your project, use the right tools, and follow recommended drying times. With careful preparation and the right approach, you can achieve a clean, professional look that refreshes your space and adds lasting value to your home.

Heat Pumps Explained: Efficient Heating for Today's Homes



A heat pump transfers or moves heat from one place to another. Two 'coils' of metal are joined in a closed loop, filled with refrigerant and separated by a system of pumps and compressors. Running the pump draws heat from one coil to the other, concentrating heat on one half of the system while cooling the other one down in the process. A heat pump does not move or exchange air from outside. What are the benefits of a heat pump?

A heat pump is the most efficient and least expensive way to heat your home. While a traditional high-efficiency furnace may run at 96% or 97% efficiency, heat pumps are often rated at 300% (or more!).

Cold-Climate-rated heat pumps are designed for our Canadian winters and can reliably supply most of the heating load of a typical Ontario home. On particularly cold days your traditional furnace, boiler or electric heat works in conjunction with the heat pump to keep your house warm. Heat pumps are often quieter than a traditional furnace inside, as there's no roaring burner. They can be installed in traditional ductwork just like an air conditioner. In houses without ductwork, mini-split (or ductless) systems can be installed, replacing noisy and inefficient window or portable A/C units.

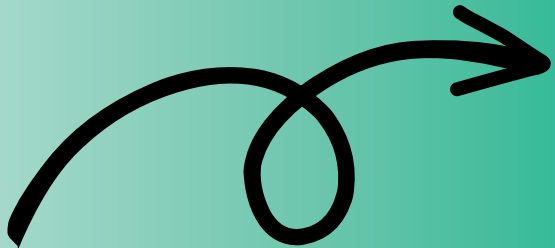

INGREDIENTS

Dry Rub Ingredients:

- 1 tbsp kosher salt
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 1 tsp Chinese five spice
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 tsp brown sugar
- Zest of 1 lime

Mix together and set aside.

Beer & Aromatics:

- 1 can light lager (Canadian works great – crisp & clean)
- Drink or pour off half the beer before adding aromatics.

Add into can:

- 1 tbsp soy sauce
- 1 tsp sesame oil
- 2 slices fresh ginger
- 1 smashed garlic clove
- 1 stalk green onion (rough chop)

Sweet Soy Chili Glaze Ingredients:

- ½ cup soy sauce
- ¼ cup honey
- 2 tbsp brown sugar
- 2 tbsp sweet chili sauce
- 1 tbsp rice vinegar
- 1 tsp grated fresh ginger
- 1 tsp garlic (minced)
- ½ tsp chili flakes (optional heat)

METHOD

- Prep the Chicken by rubbing it with Oil. Rub with the Dry Rub Ingredients (Make sure to get all the nooks and crannies and especially the inside of the cavity)
- Make the Glaze: Simmer everything for 10 minutes, until glossy and slightly thick.
- Cool slightly (it will thicken more as it rests).
- Preheat the BBQ (for Indirect Heat) to 350F
- Open can of Beer and empty half (preferably by drinking it) and place the aromatics into the can. Lower the chicken cavity onto the can so it is sitting up.
- Transfer the Chicken to roasting tray and place on Grill. Cook for about 1 hour and 15mins.
- Brush Glaze during Final 20 mins of cooking time.
- Take out and rest for 10 minutes and brush with remaining glaze
- Finish with toasted sesame seeds, fresh cilantro and lime wedges
- Serve with steamed rice, freshly steamed Bao buns or Carve the Chicken and Serve with fresh toasted buns

The Children's Safety Village of Belleville has always been built on a simple but powerful idea: **when a community works together, incredible things can happen.**

For many years, the Village has provided thousands of local children with hands-on safety education in an environment designed just for them. Through partnerships with local organizations, schools, emergency services, and community leaders, the Village has become a place where children learn essential life skills that help keep them safe at home, at school, and in their communities.

Today the Children's Safety Village is entering a new chapter. With growing demand for programming and a renewed vision for the future, the organization is preparing for the development of a new Safety Village that will allow even more children to benefit from these important lessons. Just like the original Village, the next one will be built by the community, for the community. The Village was created through the dedication of many partners including the Quinte Home Builders Association, Belleville Police Services, Belleville Fire Department, local school boards, service clubs, and many businesses and community members across the region. Since the beginning, QHBA members have played an important role in helping build and maintain the Village. Builders, tradespeople, suppliers, and others contributed materials, expertise, and funding to help construct the miniature town where children learn vital safety lessons. Their involvement reflects the association's broader commitment to building strong and safe communities for families across the Bay of Quinte region. What makes the Children's Safety Village so impactful is its interactive approach to learning. Designed as a scaled-down town complete with buildings, streets, traffic lights, road signs, and a railway crossing, the Village allows children to experience real-world safety situations in a controlled and engaging environment.

Students from Kindergarten to Grade Six participate in programs covering important topics such as pedestrian and bicycle safety, fire prevention and emergency preparedness, railway safety, electrical safety, injury prevention, and home safety. These experiences help children develop confidence and awareness that can stay with them for a lifetime.

Under the leadership of its new Executive Director, and strong Board of Directors, the Children's Safety Village is expanding its programming and exploring new opportunities to serve the community. Future initiatives include programs focused on internet safety, digital awareness, the risks of distracted driving and other modern safety challenges facing children today. The CSV is also expanding into other new exciting areas such as seniors programs for digital literacy. As the organization plans for a new facility, community involvement will once again play a critical role. The next Safety Village will provide a modern and accessible learning space capable of reaching more students while continuing to offer free safety education to local schools.

The Quinte Home Builders Association remains proud to support the Children's Safety Village. Builders understand that communities are more than the homes we construct. They are the places where children grow, learn, and build their futures.

Food security has become an increasingly important conversation across Canada. Over the past few years, many households have noticed rising grocery prices, supply chain disruptions, and the growing pressure on local food banks. While Canada remains a food-rich country, the reality is that many of the foods we rely on every day travel a long way to reach our tables.

Currently, an estimated 75 percent of our fresh fruit and about 50 percent of our fresh vegetables are imported. When transportation, weather events, global supply chains, or production challenges affect these systems, Canadians feel the impact through higher prices and reduced availability.

At the same time, healthy food choices are becoming more expensive for many families. When budgets tighten, households may be forced to rely on less nutritious options, which can have long-term impacts on overall health and well-being.

Start growing food

Our outdoor spaces are full of potential for producing food. While beautiful landscaping will always have a place in our yards, many homeowners are rediscovering how easy it can be to grow a portion of their own food.

Vegetables like kale, tomatoes, beans, lettuce, and herbs can be grown in traditional gardens, raised beds, containers, or even on balconies and patios.

With a little planning, homeowners can integrate food plants into existing landscapes without sacrificing aesthetics. For those who prefer lower-maintenance gardening, there are also many simple approaches that make growing food easier than ever. Container gardens, vertical growing systems, and small raised beds can provide meaningful harvests with minimal effort.

Support Local Growers
